

2018 Global Health Innovation Summer Internship

Learn first-hand about innovation in global healthcare delivery
Support the growth and scale of early-stage ventures
Develop consulting skills in a global context

Innovations in Healthcare (iiH) is a nonprofit organization hosted by Duke University and founded in 2011 by Duke Health, McKinsey & Company, and the World Economic Forum. The organization aims to improve healthcare worldwide by supporting the scale and impact of promising innovations. Innovations in Healthcare collaborates closely with the **Duke Global Health Innovation Center** (GHIC), part of the Duke Global Health Institute (DGHI). The Center studies and supports the scaling and adaptation of innovations, and related policy reforms, to address critical health challenges worldwide.

We are hiring two **Duke University MBA interns** to provide expertise to exciting start-up organizations and interact with innovators at the forefront of global health. Interns will support our accelerator program for USAID Saving Lives at Birth (SL@B) grantees. The SL@B program is funded in partnership with international development organizations including USAID, the Government of Norway (Norad), the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Grand Challenges Canada (funded by the Government of Canada), the U.K.'s Department for International Development (DFID) and the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA). The Duke Global Health Innovation Center is leading Accelerating SL@B, a program that provides scaling and growth support to SL@B grantees, primarily early-stage innovations within maternal and child health.

Interns will work with the Accelerating SL@B core project team to create deliverables that support capacity building and scaling, such as marketing plans, business and financial models, competitive market analyses, or a growth assessment tool. The specific projects and deliverables are tailored to students' interests and skills, as well as the program needs. Interns will be supported by Duke Global Health Innovation Center staff and potentially by Accelerating SL@B implementing partners.

The internship is 10-12 weeks long (40 hours per week) and based in Durham, NC with international and domestic travel. The internship will launch in late May with a 4-day innovator workshop in Nairobi, Kenya, through which interns will meet the program participants and learn more about the innovator portfolio. Interns will also support USAID's DevelopmentXchange event in Washington, DC in late July. There may be additional short-term travel to innovator sites during the summer. Compensation is \$15 per hour and travel expenses are covered. The internship qualifies for the CASE Summer Internship Matching Fund, potentially increasing the salary. (Interns must apply and be approved.)

This opportunity is open to Duke University MBA students.
