About the project

The Making More Health (MMH) Ventures4Change program will partner with university students to develop practical solutions aimed at **improving hygiene in schools**. Students will take part in a 6-part workshop series that address a wide variety of social entrepreneurship concepts and global health series geared towards helping the students assess business problems, identify market opportunities, and transform ideas into compelling businesses/solutions.

Innovations in Healthcare is a non-profit organization co-founded by Duke University, McKinsey & Company, and the World Economic Forum, which is hosted at Duke. It aims to improve healthcare and advance health worldwide by sourcing, strengthening, scaling, and studying the best healthcare innovations globally. Its mission is to source, strengthen, study and scale promising healthcare innovations, increasing access to quality, affordable healthcare worldwide. Innovations in Healthcare has developed a network of 92 healthcare innovators (social enterprises) operating in over 70 countries.

The Making More Health (MMH) Ventures4Change program is supported through Boehringer Ingelheim's Making More Health Initiative. About the role

Under the supervision of the Innovations in Healthcare's Africa Regional Director, the fellow shall work with the project partners to coordinate, plan and implement the project ensuring the successful achievement of the set project milestones.

This is a 5-month fellowship and will be based in Nairobi, Kenya.

Responsibilities

- Participate in the selection and recruitment of project participants, judges and mentors to take part in the project
- Oversee the implementation of the training workshops and continuous student participation in the training workshops
- Act as a liaison between the students and Innovations in Healthcare



- Work with the project team to plan and implement the idea competition and mini-pilot implementation phases of the project
- Plan and oversee all logistical aspects of the project
- Participate in reviewing the mini-pilot reports and selection of winners
- Oversee the day-to-day implementation of the project

Expected Deliverables

- Prepare monthly update reports
- Publish blogs highlighting the MMH venture4change project and ideas competition
- Prepare a handover report/presentation at the end of the fellowship period
- Prepare and present a report to the project partners at the end of the fellowship documenting lessons learnt during project implementation

Qualifications

The ideal candidate will be:

- A recent graduate in health sciences, biomedical science or a related field (pharmacy, medicine, project management or business development) will be preferable
- Have a passion for the healthcare sector
- Must have excellent written and oral communication skills.
- Superior project management skills and attention to detail.
- Must have a can-do, positive attitude.
- Must possess strong problem-solving skills and the ability to think strategically.
- Must be a self-starter who is comfortable working independently to complete projects with little supervision, as well as part of a team.
- Must be results oriented and able to deliver under pressure
